## YBGR Pheasant Program

In 2019, Yellowstone Academy, the fully accredited K-12 school right on the YBGR campus, added a new program to the Vo-Ag department...pheasants! The boys and girls at YBGR now get to take part in monitoring egg incubation, raising chicks, building pheasant pens, and continuously caring for the birds.

Raising the birds helps kids maintain daily obligations and learn more about an animal's life cycle. Once the pheasants are fully grown, the birds are either released to wetland sites in the area or sold to individual landowners to replenish the pheasant population. Proceeds from the program go right back into supporting Yellowstone Academy's efforts to provide the highest quality of education to its students.

The program keeps about fifty hens and fifteen roosters as breeding stock for the following year's program, and eggs and live chicks are purchased as well to supplement those hatched at the Ranch. The pheasants are just another way YBGR is enriching the lives of troubled boys and girls.
