EARL & FAY DONEY SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Eligibility & Criteria for Selection

All candidates for an Alumni Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

College of Education, Health & Human Development

- A. Recipients must be enrolled or planning to enroll in elementary education, early childhood development / education, or counseling.
 - B. Recipients must be graduates of a Montana High School.
 - C. The selection process shall give preference to current or former students of the Yellowstone Academy who have identified themselves as such by February 1st of each year.
 - D. The scholarship may be renewed to completion of the degree provided the recipient is making satisfactory progress.

- A. Recipients must be enrolled or planning to enroll in Electrical Engineering.
 - B. Recipients must be graduates of a Montana High School.
 - C. The selection process shall give preference to current or former students of the Yellowstone Academy who have identified themselves as such by February 1st of each year.
 - D. The scholarship may be renewed to completion of the degree provided the recipient is making satisfactory progress.

**Selection, Number,
Amount and Use
of Scholarships**

- 1. The annual distribution is divided equally to support one or more scholarships in each: the College of Education, Health & Human Development and the Department of Electrical & Computer Engineering.
 - 2. The selection(s) is made by the College of Education, Health & Human Development and the Department of Electrical & Computer Engineering in accordance with Montana State University's policies and guidelines.
